Pat Musolino says her late husband, Frank, 'looked for years' for a property where he and his son could share their love for hunting. Twenty years ago, he paid \$2 million for this 1,052-acre property in Worth County, Ga. 'It was always a work in progress, Ms. Musolino says. 'It was his pride and joy.'



Mr. Musolino oversaw construction of a 5,500-square-foot lodge and helped to design the surrounding acreage. Today the land includes five man-made lakes, one of which spans 15 acres, a barn, hunting stands and a road system.

The Musolinos, who often vacationed in Colorado, were inspired by log houses there and decided to build their own in Georgia. 'Plans to build a little log house grew into this 5,500-square-foot home,' says the 64-year-old Ms. Musolino, who calls herself a homemaker and 'hunter's wife.'
