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HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE · NATURAL BRIDGE & THE CIVIL WAR

On **MARCH 6, 1865**, a scratch Confederate force — the 1st Florida Militia, cavalry, and teenage cadets of the **West Florida Seminary** (the forerunner of Florida State University) — repulsed a larger Union column in three charges at the point where the St. Marks River runs beneath a natural bridge, just ≈8.5 miles south of the property. The victory kept **Tallahassee the only Confederate state capital east of the Mississippi River never captured during the Civil War**. The battlefield is preserved today as Natural Bridge Battlefield Historic State Park, with an annual reenactment each March.
